The High Desert Marines (HDM) were represented on the judging panel for the California Cadet Corps (CACC), 18th Brigade, Individual Major Awards Competition on February 22. Hjördis Jones, HDM Public Relations officer served as one of the esteemed judges for the annual event. Also assisting with the judging was HDM member Jeff Valasquez who was representing Excelsior School where he is an instructor.

The cadets were required to deliver a self-prepared speech on a topic of current national interest, and answer a series of questions covering cadet subjects they have been taught during their time in the program. Competitors were judged on their poise, appearance, knowledge, self-confidence, awareness of current events, and the quality of their speech. The first place winners in each age division advance to the State Championships in April.

The California Cadet Corps is a component of the California National Guard, Youth and Community Programs Task Force. It is a school-based youth leadership development program and the oldest of its kind, having been established in 1911. The purpose of the Corps is to provide schools and students with a quality educational and leadership development program that prepares students for success in college and the work force. The program serves 10 schools in the High Desert.
